In this course we will read from the work of India's best known poet from the

classical period, $K \square Iid \square sa$, with a focus on his famous Raghuva¹ $\square \square \square a$ (The Story of the Raghu Family).

Course/Module aims:

The course has two main goals. First, to impart the students with a quick and smooth technique of reading Sanskrit. Second, to familiarize the students with $K \square Iid \square Sa's$ corpus and, through it, of some basic conventions of Sanskrit literature.
