Course/Module description:

Over the past two decades the impact of social media in daily life has grown dramatically. In parallel, social media platforms have become essential tools to spread hate speech or disinformation. The rapid and multiple distribution of hate content across social media, blogs, messaging apps, discussion forums but also on the online commentary sections of quality media makes antisemitism, racism and xenophobia generally more acceptable in the mainstream discourse and leads to normalisation of discriminatory comments. Antisemitism remains one of the most common forms of online hate speech, a fact that led to the implementation of the term "Antisemitism 2.0". A major objective of this course is to describe and analyse the phenomenon "Antisemitism 2.0" considering its different manifestations and persistent patterns. Discussed should be also the increasing antimuslim hate speech and other forms of online racism and discrimination.
