Course/Module description:

This course deals with love poetry, the theory of love and the motifs of love found in Kitāb al-Zahrah, an anthology of poetry compiled by Muḥammad Ibn Dāwūd al-Iṣfahānī (d. 910) that consists of one hundred chapters. The course examines the structure and content of the book, sheds light on several facets found in love poetry and investigates the anthologist's outlook and perception of love.

Course/Module aims:

The course aims to study the structure and content of Kitab al-Zahra and examine the theory of love in classical Arabic Literature.
