Course/Module description:

The course deals with Ancient Egyptian burial as preparation for the afterlife. As part of the study, we will discuss the Egyptians' hopes for the Realm of the Dead, and their fears of what awaits them after death. We will also learn about the ways the Egyptians dealt with the fears and difficulties expected in the Realm of the Dead.

Course/Module aims:

To introduce students to the central ideas expressed in Egyptian burial on the one hand, and in the large corpus of funerary texts and tomb decoration in ancient Egypt on the other.

<u>Learning outcomes - On successful completion of this module, students should be able to:</u>

List key ideas in the Egyptian Realm of the Dead.

Identify key themes in tomb decorations.

Distinguish between the various types of funerary texts and know how to associate them with the different historical periods in ancient Egypt.

Point out conceptual developments according to a timeline.

Locate a bibliography relevant to the topics being studied.
