Course/Module description:

This course is designed for students who speak Russian at the primary level and are interested in expanding vocabulary (including the most common expressions used in spoken Russian). The students will learn how to express their opinions and conduct a discussion on various topics in fields of history and culture, politics and economics.

The course is based on the study of Russian journalism - including the modern press and Internet sources.

Course/Module aims:

To provide the necessary tools and skills to hold conversation on various topics; to expand the vocabulary with an emphasis on learning common phrases of spoken language; to provide writing skills.

Learning outcomes - On successful completion of this module, students should be able to:

Knowledge and speech skills:

1. Q & A:

- question - hypothesis; The ability to examine the correctness of a self-hypothesis; Different methods for an answer to a given question.

2. Message and response to the message. Communicating with the interlocutor and developing the conversation.

3. Assessment of the situation and the transfer of information in relation to its significance, credibility and objectivity. An indication of the unusualness of the fact, an indication of the evidence of the fact, an expression of certainty of the fact.
4. Action and response to incentives: different forms of incentive and response.

- 1) Russia pagan and orthodox: beliefs, customs.
- 2) The idea of the Jewish world in Russia.
