Course/Module description:

A basic course in Latin for students with no previous knowledge of the language.

Course/Module aims:

The course aims to provide students with knowledge of Latin morphology and syntax, the ability to analyse and translate simple classical Latin texts, as well as with basic vocabulary.

Learning outcomes - On successful completion of this module, students should be able to:

- to classify and identify the principal elements of Latin morphology.*
- to identify main syntactical constructions and cope with their translation into the syntax of modern languages.*
- to use comprehensive Latin dictionaries.*
- to combine the above elements in order to translate sentences and continuous texts of simple classical Latin prose.*

Requirements:
