Course/Module description:

*This course is a linguistic introduction of modern Spanish, which includes its most elementary structures -with emphasis on the use of the subjunctive- and the standard principles of normative spelling (according to the RAE).*

*Reading written texts, especially journalistic and literary, with an intermediate degree of difficulty and writing summaries are part of the course's tasks.*

Course/Module aims:

*Acquisition of skills by students to deal with texts in Spanish, understand and summarize them, and improve their skills in writing.*

Learning outcomes - On successful completion of this module, students should be able to:

- *Understand texts of intermediate difficulty.*
- *Write texts in Spanish whose reading will be orderly, clear, and coherent.*
- *Identify the common morphological forms and some syntactic patterns, such as subjunctive tenses.*
