<u>Course/Module description:</u> This introduction to poetry and aesthetics by Paul Celan (1920-1970) takes up, the debate about the question of a not possible poetry after the »shoah«. The considerations of Theodor W. Adorno (1903-1969) in the context of a possible culture after the »holocaust« and the confrontation of Paul Celan with Martin Heidegger (1889-1976), which he expresses in his poem about this philosopher, also reflect the precarious relationship to language that Celan coexists with tried to overcome a linguistic expression yet to be found.

<u>Course/Module aims:</u>

The following poetry books are considered: »Der Sand aus den Urnen« (1948), »Mohn und Ged¤chtnis« (1952), »Von Schwelle zu Schwelle« (1955), »Sprachgitter« (1959), »Die Niemandsrose« (1963), »Atemwende« (1967), »Fadensonnen« (1968), »Lichtzwang« (1970), »Schneepart« (1971), »Zeitgeh¶ft« (1976), »Eingedunkelt« (1991).

Learning outcomes - On successful completion of this module, students should be able to:

Understand the poetic overall work, apply lyric theory in practice, interpret poetic texts with current methods.
