Course/Module description:

Since 1967 Ingeborg Bachmann speaks of a »death-type«-project and of the case of Franza »Der Fall Franza« (1978) which is to represent the first »type of death«. It is supposed to be a book that consists of several books and a compendium of the crimes that are secretly and unpunished before our eyes. Above all, this author is primarily concerned with the continuation of the war between the gender and their relationships. With the case of Malina »Malina« (1971), her »death-type«-project continues. Due to the premature death of the author, the project is unfortunately not completed.

Course/Module aims:

The following books are considered: »Male oscuro« (1963/64), »Das Buch Franza« (1964/1965), »Das Buch Goldmann« (1965/66), »Das Buch Malina« (1966/67).

Learning outcomes - On successful completion of this module, students should be able to:

Understanding the prosaic overall work of the lyricist Ingeborg Bachmann as a new narrative approach and innovative writing attempt and application of literary theories in literary studies practice and interpretation of literary texts using current methods.
