Course/Module description:

The course deals with central topics in the social and educational psychology of the

classroom and the school. Topics will include: classroom management, biases, self-fulfilling prophecies (Pygmalion Effect and Golem Effect), teachers' differential behavior toward different students, classroom social structure and sociometric measurement, classroom observations, seating locations, discipline, students' perceptions and judgments, classroom climate, and students' evaluations of teachers.
