Course/Module description:

In this course we will read from India's classical drama tradition, and in particular "The Crown-Jewel of Wonders by the probably southern author Shaktibhadra, a play that tells the story of the Ramayana

Course/Module aims:

The course has two main goals. First, to impart the students with a quick and smooth technique of reading Sanskrit. Second, to familiarize the students with Sanskrit drama and, through it, of some basic conventions of Sanskrit literature. More advanced students will be asked to read a learned commentary that accompanies this play.

To read smoothly and quickly a Sanskrit text of medium difficulty, to become familiar with dramatic literature and, more specifically, with Shaktibhadra's style and work.
