Course/Module description:

In the course we will survey the historical developments that took place in the Middle East and elsewhere from the appearance of Islam to the rise of the Ottoman Empire and its conquest of most of the Arab world. In other words, we will deal with the years ca. 600-1500 CE, in the region stretching from the Atlantic Ocean to India and Central Asia. Learning will be based on a combination of lectures and independent reading by the students. The course will deal with the political, religious, military, social, economic and cultural aspects of the history of the region. Every two weeks there will be a voluntary "tutorial" for those who want to strengthen their understanding of the material.

Course/Module aims:

The students will learn about the main events and developments that occurred during the first 9 centuries of Islamic history in the Middle East and elsewhere. This will naturally include an acquaintance with the basis names, terms and locations in Islamic history in this period. The students will also gain knowledge of the methodological problems related to Islamic historiography and the historical discipline at large.
