- 7. The Ashuraa "Celebrating the Mourning" Shi'ite customs and symbolism
- 8. Popular Shi'a, Taqiyya, and Sunni Shi'a differences

- 10. Mashhad and Qom their importance and status, the Eighth Imam Al-Rida and his sister, traditions, and vows.
