Course/Module description:

The course aims at equipping students with knowledge of intermediate level Turkish, which will allow them to understand texts and participate in conversations of corresponding complexity. Thematically, the course combines topics from daily life and more complex subjects like problems of the modern society.

Course/Module aims:

The aim of the course is to equip students with sufficient grammar and vocabulary and provide them with sufficient practice so that they are able to read and understand texts and participate in conversations at the intermediate level.

- read and understand texts of the intermediate level of complexity;
- understand other people's speech and express themselves discussing topics from their daily lives and more complex subjects (emotions, societal problems);

Teaching arrangement and method of instruction: The course is mostly taught through communicative approach with elements of task-based, cooperative and structural approach.

Course/Module Content:

The grammar topics covered in the course include:

Reported Past Tense; Simple Present ("Broad") Tense; subordinate clauses of time, purpose and cause; grammatical structures of comparison; double conjunctions; regular and adverbial participles; gerunds; the abilitative mood; direct speech constructions; reported speech of the imperative mood.
