Course/Module description:

The intensive archaeological research in the Holy Land revealed hundreds of churches, chapels and monasteries. The rich archeological finds attest to a rich and active Christian community that continued flourishing under Umayyad rule. During the course we will discuss the distribution of the churches, the identity of donors, architectural typology of the churches, furniture and liturgical objects, liturgical changes, discovery of regional mosaic workshops and the iconography of the mosaics.

Course/Module aims:

Create methodology and tools for understanding and analyzing of the architecture and the art of the churches of the Holy Land in the Byzantine and Umayyad periods.

Learning outcomes - On successful completion of this module, students should be able to:

In the future, the students will be able to understand the architectural plan of the churches and the finds during the archaeological excavations and their scientific publication.

Teaching arrangement and method of instruction: Frontal teaching

Course/Module Content:

1. Distribution of the churches.
2. Architectural typology of the churches: basilica.
3. Architectural typology of the churches: centralized church, hall church and Cross-shaped church.
4. Internal development in churches – changes in the liturgical space and furniture.
5. Liturgical objects.
6. Crosses in the church. Crosses in the mosaic floors of churches against the background of the edict of Theodosius II.

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7. Geometric carpets, central medallion or pseudo-emblema and diagonal schemes in mosaic floors.
 8. vegetal carpets in the nave and aisles.
 9. Special compositions and their relationship with entrances.
 10. Daily life in mosaic pavements.
 11. Daily life in the framework of time and place.
 12. Visible and hidden Christian messages in the halls of churches.
 13. Composition and iconography in the liturgical area.
 14. Iconoclasm and its expression in the mosaic pavements and liturgical furniture.
