Course/Module description:

This is a unique joint course for students of the Hebrew University and the University of Haifa and it is open to all students at both universities. At the center of the course are reading and writing as a space of encounter and as a record of dialogue with nature. In the last three decades, a new trend has been developing in the study of literature that focuses on the relationship between literature and the environment. It is a diverse and multidisciplinary approach that focuses on reading works of literature in environmental contexts. It deals with the various ways in which nature is imagined by man and the ways in which these imaginations may affect reality.

The course consists of a theoretical division of reading and studying key texts in the field of environmental criticism and will be held in Zoom, alongside a three-day field workshop outside the campus under full board conditions, during which the students will experience learning and direct contact with and observing nature. The meetings will be held in Klil, in the Western Galilee, on April 16-18, 2024. The course is intended for students who wish to deepen their knowledge and understanding in the field of the environmental humanistic and the relationship between humans and nature, and for students who wish to experience reading and writing in Nature Writing genre.

Course/Module aims:

To integrate critical thinking about human existence in nature (which is not separate from this existence) and to express themselves in non-fictional writing in relation to landscape.
