Course/Module description:

In the Middle of the night, three men to the bank of the Vltava in Prague, cities and mud river edge contact from a human figure. Then rotate - one by one - seven times, the right of the body to the left, while saying the names of saints. The first Sejm seven laps heated mud golem's body was burning red. Second surrounded and cooled, and steam rose from the body cooling. At the end of the third lap - Rabbi Judah Loew ben Bezalel, the Maharal of Prague known to us - Golem opened his eyes and stood up. Then, that night in 1588, began created the legend of the Golem of Prague.

Course/Module aims:

In this course we will discuss key issues thought a German company - like bureaucracy crude capitalism gross money foolishly , crude technology - using texts of major sociologists German most important (Marx , through Weber, thinkers of the Frankfurt School to Ulrich Beck) and see how their writing is in relation to Prague's legendary . Naturally, the course will also be based on the writings of Franz Kafka , in order to expand the understanding of the transformation of human consciousness , which lost the Agency of its modernity . Through the use of various means seems that sociology, literature, poetry and film are different narratives used the story of uncontrollable monsters and Faust who sold his soul to the devil . For the expansion of space we will be a comparative analysis with other mythological stories : Mary Shelley's Frankenstein (which is an incarnation of the Golem story) and Dr. Faustus of Marlowe , Goethe and Thomas Mann.
