We will study and practice the investment management process including, economic reviews, risk management and performance attribution. The fund is managed against a passive benchmark.

Course/Module aims:

To understand financial markets, study various financial instrument, implement different investment strategies including hedging, perform security analysis, implement performance measurement methods and basic risk management.

Understand the investment process, analyze financial markets, identify relevant and useful information, attribute performance to investment positions, measure and attribute risk. The whole framework of the course is similar to a mutual fund managed against a benchmark.
