Course/Module description:

The course includes 5 sessions, on five consecutive Tuesdays, at 8:15 to 12:00. The first meeting is held at Ein Kerem and includes:

- Review of the structure of the course and its goals
- Lectures on various topics related to medicine and society

The second, third and fourth sessions include educational tours in small groups. During the educational tour the students will listen to a lecture by an expert in the field, and will meet with staff and patients.

The fifth session is a summary of the course, and is held in Ein Kerem. This session includes discussion in small groups.

The goal of this course is to introduce medical students to populations with special medical and social needs.

Upon completion of the course, the students will recognize the broad social, cultural, educational and political contexts of health and medicine and will be aware of the importance of these contexts to doctor-patient communication and medical care Specifically, the course will deal with the following topics:

- 1. The right for health of migrant workers, asylum seekers and prisoners
- 2. Domestic Violence
- 3. Physical Disabilities
- 4. Intellectual disability (mental retardation)
- 5. Coping with mental illness in the community
